State Library of Queensland

Christene Drewe reported on her new role in the *Australian Library of Art*, including the organisation of artist interviews for the *James Souris Collection* series and resources selection for ALA. Joan Bruce is now in the SL Engagement Team.

Griffith University, QCA Library –Therese reported on 2 initiatives:

- Proposed implementation of the Omeka platform for publishing Qld College of Art and Griffith Film School digital exhibitions and archives, representing the creative works of Griffith University students and researchers;
- Proposed exhibition of Griffith Review posters (representing the history of Griffith Review) at QCA Library.

Logan City Council Libraries

Logan City Council Libraries have retagged the entire collection to change to a *Radio Frequency Identification (RFID)* environment. The project was successfully completed in March 2018. Each library item has an RFID tag which is read through radio waves. This means customers can borrow and return items through a self-checkout system.

The libraries received a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) Grant from the State Library of Queensland in 2017, for the purchase of robots and Virtual Reality equipment to run workshops for children and adults in the Logan Community.

QUT Library is preparing to host With the Ball at Her Feet: **A living history of Brisbane women's football** <https://www.withtheballatherfeet.com.au/>

Dr Lee McGowan was the 2016-17 recipient of a *Lord Mayor's Helen Taylor Award* for local history, which funded his research into the fascinating history of women's football in Brisbane. <https://www.brisbane.qld.gov.au/community-safety/grants-awards/creative-history-grants/brisbane-history-grants/lord-mayors-helen-taylor-research-award-local-history>

The project aimed to research women's football (soccer) in Brisbane, to capture its history and stories and to exhibit its heritage. The project delivered an interactive digital archive, enhanced by social media, and several publications. During the project, Lee benefitted from the advice and connections of Kate Harbison, Creative Industries librarian at QUT and local history library at BCC Library - Wynnum.

Chermside Library hosted the physical exhibition until February 2018, with Lee delivering seminars at several Northside and Southside branches during February and March.

Now it is QUT Library's turn!

ArliS/ANZ colleagues will be invited to view the exhibition when it spends some time at QUT Kelvin Grove Library, and to hear Lee speak with his characteristic enthusiasm about football, particularly the women's game.
